Dear Parents/Carers and Students of Year 12,

Y12 Distance Learning Expectations

It is likely that the school closure will continue for a number of months. This means that almost **½ of Year 12's sixth form journey may have to be conducted online.**

It is therefore vital that Year 12 students fully engage with distance learning as they would engage with their normal school work so that they can graduate from sixth form in the summer of 2021 with results that they are proud of. The majority of Year 12 had a brilliant start with distance learning last term but we appreciate that it's a lot to get used to.

Please therefore read the below very carefully so that you are all prepared for when **online lessons resume on Monday 20th April:**

Expectations: Students must

- **Be online for their normal lesson times.** These are the lesson times they followed whilst physically in school. Teachers will be providing work and teaching a lesson through Google Hangouts.
 - If a student cannot make a lesson, it is their responsibility to contact the teacher before the lesson and explain why.
- **Fully participate with online lessons** in the same way they would engage with a normal lesson in school.
 - Answer questions.
 - Contribute to discussions.
 - Complete all work set on time and HAND IN on Google Classroom so that your teachers can feed back.
 - If you are struggling to do work on a computer / phone, you can handwrite it and email a photo to your teacher.

Rewards

- **Receiving a quality education** - All lessons teach students essential content for their qualifications. There will not be time when school reopens to re-teach this; the time is now.
- **Excellent exam and coursework grades** - Teachers are producing quality lessons and giving individual feedback to ensure success at sixth form. Engage with it fully!



Sanctions

On the rare occasions where students are not engaging with lessons or completing work, they will fall behind. Depending on the frequency and severity, the consequences may include:

- **Contacting parents** - A register of all attendance to lessons and work completed is being taken and this may be shared with parents. We will contact parents so they know if a student is not engaging with the work.
- **Not being able to complete your chosen courses** - students who have missed so much material that it is not possible for them to catch up when school reopens, will not be able to continue on a specific course.
- **Having to repeat year 12** - students who have missed so much material that it is not possible for them to catch up when school reopens, will not be able to continue on to Year 13 and will need to repeat Year 12.
- **Not returning into year 13** - We do not want to lose anyone, but if you are not completing work, you will not be able to carry on at the school and will need to look at alternative options. .

Difficulties?

If students are having difficulties with accessing work, they should communicate as soon as possible so that the school can support them. We know everyone has very different home circumstances, equipment and access to the internet. We want everyone to be able to access the material they need to do really well in Year 12.

There are lots of ways we can help you to access the work, but until we know you are having difficulties, we cannot help. You need to be proactive and speak to staff ASAP.
