




#### You're a Clownfish! Motto: Hey, I've had another idea!

Use the Careerometer to compare different jobs — salary, working hours, etc.


Click the dotted square. Type in the first career that you think you might be interested in and select from the drop-down list, then add your second and third choice to see the comparison.

# **NEW SUBJECTS**



- 1. Some schools and colleges might offer courses in subjects you haven't studied before.

### A LEVELS SUBJECT CHOICES

- Science & Maths Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Further Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics, Electronics, Environmental Science
- Humanities History, Geography, Religious Studies, Psychology,
   Sociology, Economics, Politics, Law
- Arts & Languages English Literature, English Language, Art and Design, Drama and Theatre Studies, Film Studies, Media Studies, Music, French, German, Spanish, and other Modern Languages

IMPORTANT - to study A levels you will need both Maths & English at Grade 4+ and some A level subjects require grade 6+



- Two year Level 3 qualifications equivalent to 3 x A levels.
- Lead to a specific occupation and available in a whole range of different areas from Cyber Security to Wildlife Management.
- Include at least 3 months work experience and an opportunity to build transferable skills and knowledge related to the job area.
- Progress on to apprenticeships, jobs and university.

#### Who are they for?

They are for 16 - 19 year olds who want to focus on developing skills and knowledge for a specific occupation or job sector.





- Business (BTEC National Extended Diploma in Business)
- Health & Social Care (often leads to nursing, midwifery, social work)
- Information Technology (IT) / Computing
- Engineering (mechanical, electrical, civil, aerospace pathways)
- Sport (coaching, fitness, physical education)
- Performing Arts (dance, drama, music)
- Travel & Tourism
- Creative Media Production (film, TV, journalism, digital design)
- Art & Design (graphics, photography, fashion, fine art)
- Construction & the Built Environment
- Public Services / Uniformed Protective Services (police, fire, military prep)
- Hospitality & Catering











# **CHOOSING WHERE TO STUDY**



## **ATTEND OPEN EVENTS - things to remember:**

- Visit more than one college to compare courses and college environments
- Sixth Form Colleges have one Open Event Logic is Thursday 27th November
- FE Colleges have more than one Open Event normally an evening event and one on a Saturday
- Research the courses before you attend an Open Event, and make a plan to visit each subject/course area you are interested in
- **BUT,** don't limit yourself to those you have selected as you can also walk around the college and see if other areas may catch your eye 'Be Open and Curious"
